BACHELOR OF ARTS IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

AMU's international relations degree program offers students the opportunity to research, study, and write in the field of international relations. Since rapid globalization is blurring the boundaries of state, the discipline of international relations is increasingly connected with sociology, political economy, psychology, anthropology, and international law.

121 semester hrs / 40 courses

GENERAL EDUCATION (34 SEMESTER HRS / 11 COURSES)

Requirements include foundations of online learning, English, history, literature and humanities, science and mathematics, and social sciences.

CORE COURSES (21 SEMESTER HRS / 7 COURSES)

Students must take 7 core courses:

- » International Relations I
- » International Relations II
- » American Foreign Policy
- » Research, Analysis, and Writing
- » International Law
- » International Organizations
- » International Development

MAJOR COURSES (24 SEMESTER HRS / 8 COURSES)

Students must select 8 major courses. For concentrations, students must take all 8 courses in the same area.

Concentrations are offered in:

- » International & Transnational Security
- » Comparative & Regional Politics
- » Peacekeeping

Selected major courses include:

- » Globalization and the Market Economy
- » Global Terrorism
- » The Third World: Dependency and Development
- » Foreign Intelligence Organizations
- » International Conflict Resolution

ELECTIVES (39 SEMESTER HRS / 13 COURSES)

Students may choose from other courses not taken to meet required, core, or major requirements.
