MASTER OF ARTS IN HISTORY

Whether pursuing a bachelor's or master's degree in History, you have the chance to focus your studies on topics relevant to the demands of your chosen profession. Students are exposed to the social impact, consequences, and changes of various pivotal historical events.

36 semester hrs / 12 courses

There are two options for completing the MA in History: Thesis or Non-Thesis.

CORE COURSES (6 SEMESTER HRS / 2 COURSES)

Students take 2 core courses:

- » Historical Research Methods
- » Historiography

MAJOR COURSES (21 SEMESTER HRS / 7 COURSES)

Students must select all 7 courses in the same concentration. Concentrations are offered in:

- » Ancient and Classical History
- » American History
- » European History
- » Global History

Selected courses include:

- » The Greek Civilization
- » Medieval Europe
- » The Great War
- » World War II in Context
- » U.S. Constitutional History
- » The United States in the 20th Century
- » Insurgency and the Peasantry
- » Civil War: Seminal Event in American History

ELECTIVES (9 SEMESTER HRS / 3 COURSES)

Students may choose from other history or military history courses outside the required or major requirements.

COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT

Students may select either a Separate Comprehensive Exam (*no additional academic credit*) or a Capstone Seminar in History (*thesis option, 3 semester hrs*).

Those who elect the thesis option will only need 6 semester hours of elective credit.
